



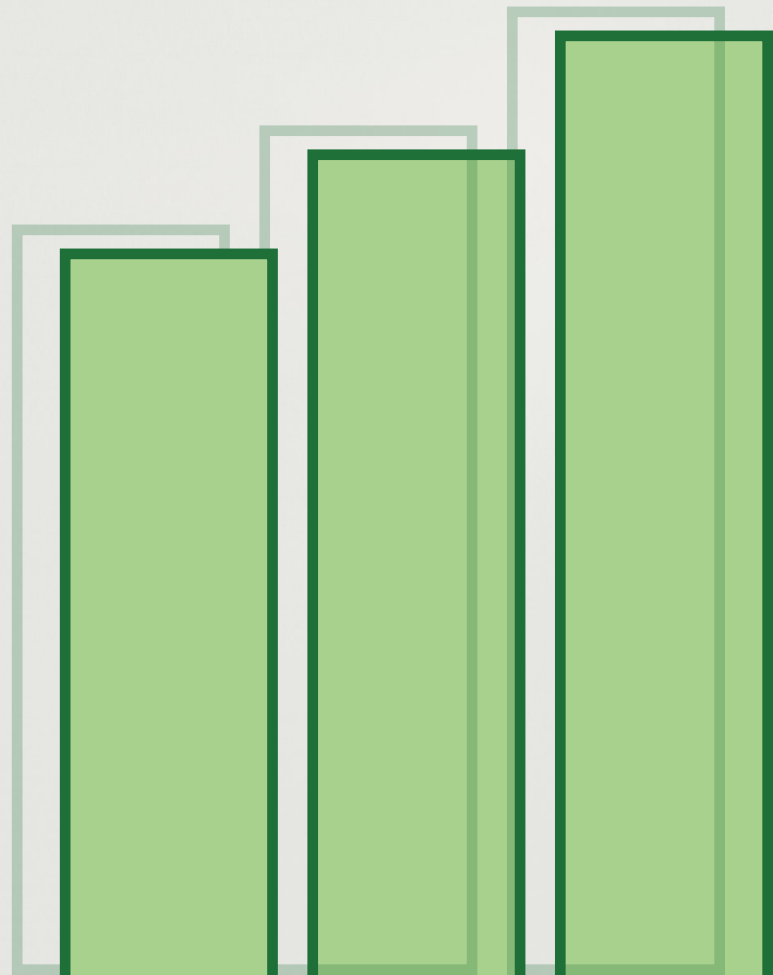
2021 Annual Report

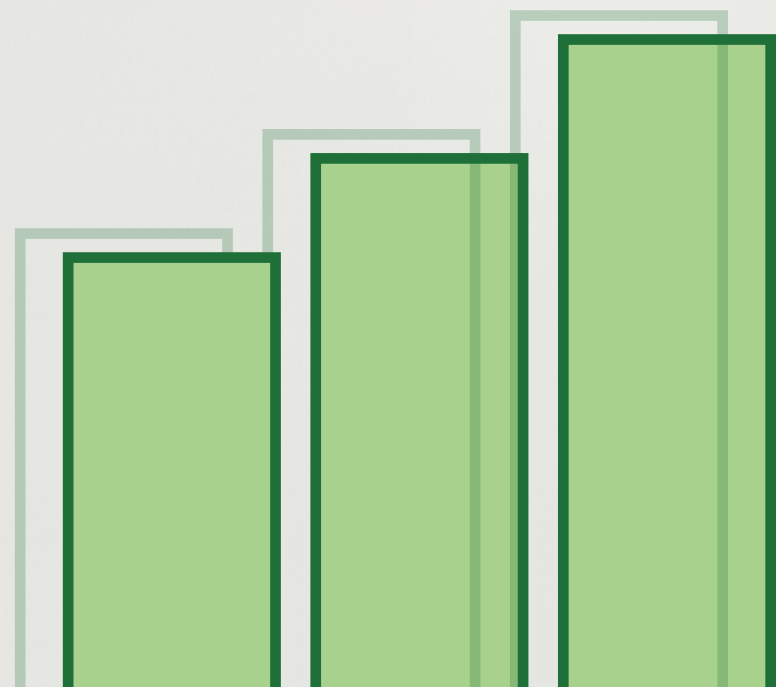

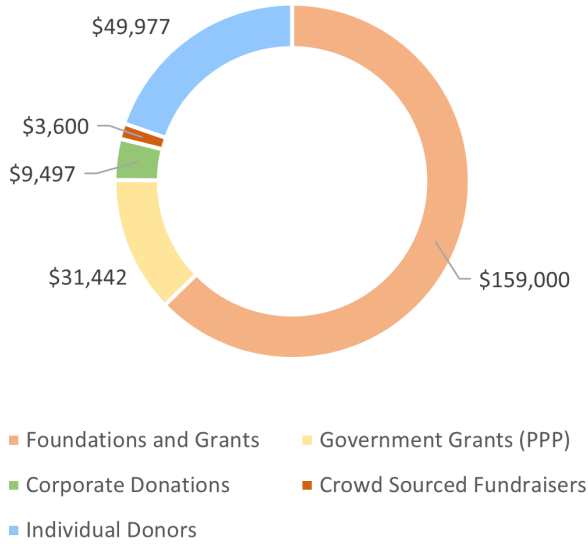

I am looking forward to this new year and excited for all the children and families we can help.

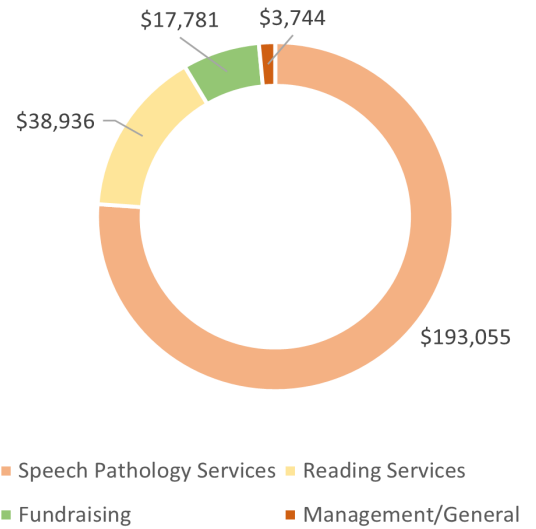


RiteCare by the Numbers

INCOME



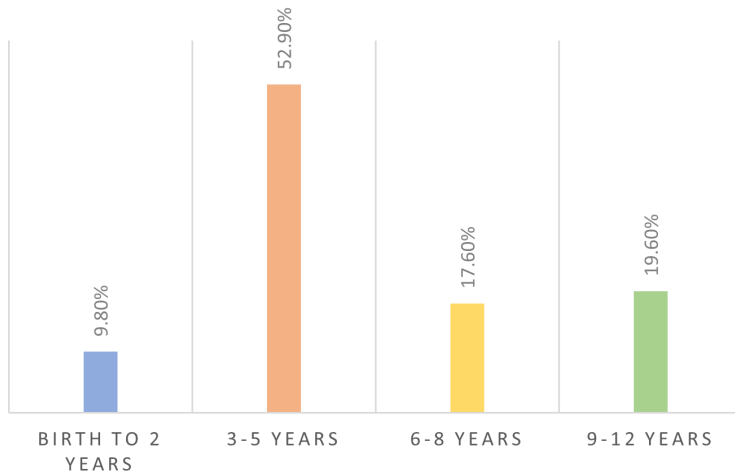
EXPENSES



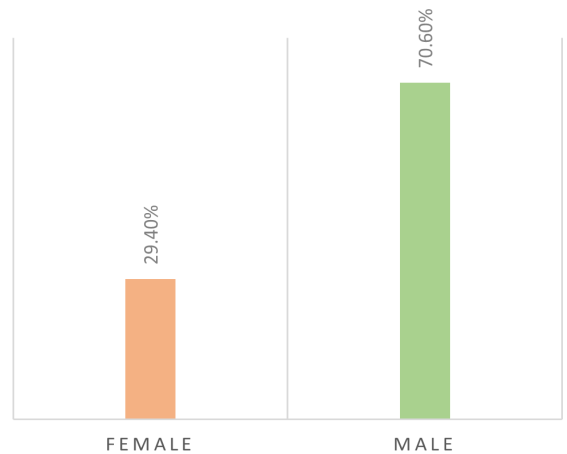

Summer Groups

This summer saw the return of our beloved summer groups in both our Salt Lake and Ogden centers. This program is, by far, RiteCare of Utah's most in-demand program. We were so thrilled to be able to invite groups of children along with their caregivers back to our buildings!

RiteCare of Utah provided group speech-language therapy to 46 children this summer. Children were offered services in one of 3 groups: language, social skills or articulation.

Over the 11-week program, children made an average gain of an 81% increase in targeted abilities.
